OFFENSES TO THE GOSPEL

The gospel of Christ is offensive to the natural man. The gospel of free and sovereign grace attributes the salvation of sinners, from Alpha to Omega; from beginning to end, to the Lord God Almighty. It stains the pride of man; it gives all the glory to God where it belongs.

But...there are some actions and attitudes that are incredibly offensive to the gospel of Christ. Joy and peace are fruits of the gospel. It is impossible to be in Christ and not have joy and peace in believing. Yet...there are some who "profess" that appear to **never**, **ever**, **have any joy or peace**. They look miserable and act miserable. If you ask them how they are they just grunt and say, "You don't want to know". Some people always seem to be in a crisis. Nothing is ever peaceful or joyful about them or their lives. This is an offense to the gospel, a stumbling block to believers and unbelievers alike.

Another hindrance and enemy to Christ and His church is **unfaithfulness**. This is a contradiction to everything the gospel teaches and is contrary to the very nature of Christ's gospel. We will not for one moment condone unfaithfulness of husbands or wives to one another, but unfaithfulness to Christ, to the gospel, to the church, appears to be easily and readily practiced and accepted by many who profess to be believers. There is one thing that we can count on about some and that is, **we can't count on them**! This is so offensive to Christ and His church!

A harsh, high-minded spirit is another offense and hindrance to Christ and His church. How often have we heard someone "pop off" and say, "I'm not going to do that...I don't care what they think!" Or "Well, that is just the way I am, if they don't like it that is their problem!" Does this sound familiar? What an offense to the gospel of *meekness and humility*.

Are you a hindrance or a help, a burden or a blessing, a servant or self-serving, callous or caring, a friend or a foe to Christ and His church? O God, keep me from being an offense of the gospel in the church and out in the world, for Christ's sake, amen.
