I Forget To Eat My Bread

Psalm 102:3-4

For my days are consumed like smoke, and my bones are burned as an hearth. My heart is smitten, and withered like grass; so that I forget to eat my bread.

I would have you first and foremost to notice in verse one of Psalm 102 that this is a prayer of the afflicted when they are overwhelmed. It seems quite easy for even believers to be overwhelmed by many things. To be overwhelmed and worried with earthly and temporal cares is to most definitely be afflicted. The only thing that should overwhelm the child of God is the grace and mercy that is given to them in Christ alone. Nevertheless we are often anxious in many things.

I have, by the grace of God, learned from experience that when a man or woman is overwhelmed in affliction they will either run to Christ or run to some other false source of comfort.
