A COMMON SALVATION

Jude said he gave all diligence and that it was needful to write unto you (that is you and I who read it), to remind us of the common salvation.

Why? There were men that came in and tried to turn brethren from The Lord Jesus Christ to something or someone else.

What is this common salvation? To start, it is called "THE" common salvation. "The" is a definite article. That means we put it in front of a noun when we understand the reader knows exactly what we are referring to.

Jude told us about the common salvation, that every Saint knows exactly of, and The Lord that did it -

"I will therefore put you in remembrance, though ye once knew this, how that <u>the</u> Lord, having <u>saved the people</u> out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed them that believed not."
