How Should We Dress for Worship Services?

Many people answer this question according to their opinion, culture, or custom. But opinions differ from person to person, cultures vary from place to place, customs change from time to time. Consequently, Jesus walking into a worship service wearing His seamless robe would be unacceptable in most churches and scandalous in some. Holy Scriptures do not dictate on this subject. But they are not silent regarding it. Here are some guidelines to follow in answer to the question "How should we dress for worship services?"

First, "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 13:14). To "put on" someone was an ancient figure of speech meaning to imitate him and be like him. Therefore, let us imitate Jesus and be like Him in our worship services, as when He told our heavenly Father "I will declare Your name to My brethren; in the midst of the assembly I will sing praise to You" (Hebrews 2:12 / Psalm 22:22).

Second, wear "the garments of salvation (Isaiah 61:10). These are the holy spiritual garments in which the Lord clothes His people from head to toe when He saves them. These garments of salvation are free. If you do not have them, obtain them now by trusting in the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ for your salvation.

Third, wear "the robe of righteousness" (Isaiah 61:10). This garment was woven by Jesus Christ through His perfect and complete fulfillment of God's law during the days of His incarnation. It is imputed to all whom God justifies. It also is freely and graciously received by trusting in the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Let us never be found dressed in the "filthy rags" of self-righteousness (Isaiah 64:6).

Fourth, wear the "white garments" Jesus exhorts us to purchase by faith in Him – "that you may be clothed, that the shame of your nakedness may not be revealed" (Revelation 3:18). Nothing approaching nakedness should be found in a worship service. And we should keep our garments white by not defiling them through contact with worldliness (Revelation 3:4).

Fifth, be "clothed with gladness" (Psalm 30:11). It is contrasted to "sackcloth", the garment of mourners, which we formerly wore. Jesus clothes us with gladness when He saves us. We therefore read: "You

have put off my sackcloth [my mourning] and clothed me with gladness, to the end that my glory may sing praise to You and not be silent. O Jehovah my God, I will give thanks to You forever." This is especially true in our worship services (Psalm 100).

Sixth, we consequently wear "the garment of praise" (Isaiah 61:3). For, when Jesus saves us, He gives to us "the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; ... that He may be glorified." Now, instead of woefully mourning for our sins, we gladly praise the One who saved us from them.

Seventh, "be clothed with humility, for 'God resists the proud, but gives grace to the humble" (1 Peter 5:5, alluding to Proverb 3:34). Do not come to a worship service boasting of yourself, your virtues, or your works. God is not impressed with them. Neither are His saints. Rather, come to the worship service boasting of Jesus and what He has done for you.

Surely we will be appropriately dressed for a worship service if we come to it clothed in these garments:

- the Lord Jesus Christ.
- the garments of His salvation,
- the robe of His righteousness,
- the undefiled white garments,
- the garment of gladness for Him,
- the garment of praise to Him,
- and in humility.

Indeed, these garments are appropriate for our everyday clothing.
