Ministering to an Angry Brother

Though Jacob was a true heir and chosen of God to reign over Esau, his experience of grace did not leave him with a proud arrogant spirit but a spirit of humility and grace. Everything that came to Jacob was a gift of God's sovereign grace. From his election of God to the spotted cattle that made up his living. It was all on God's part and all in spite of what he was by nature. So it is as he approached his angry brother that he called him lord and himself his servant. What struck me in their meeting is that all the giving was on the part of Jacob: Esau brought nothing to the table except an army of four hundred men with evil intentions. Jacob, on the other hand, gave himself, his family, his livelihood, and arranged for continual tokens of grace to meet his brother as he approached him.

If you and I will minister to this world let us understand that as God's dealings with us were altogether of grace, so our ministry to them must be all of grace. All the giving will be on our part. I expect no cooperation from natural men; only anger, resentment, and rejection. But, let me be encouraged in this: This is how God reconciles sinners. He arranges his gifts of grace to continually meet them in the way until at last they see His face and embrace Him. *“For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake.”* (2 Corinthians 4:5)

The gospel is hid to this world of lost sinners. The god of this world, although the lying deceit of free will works religion, has blinded their minds and left them in a state of unbelief and ignorance.
